You may select to receive the information by phone, text message or email. The Borough uses CodeRed, a mass notification system, to inform residents of emergency and general notifications. The data collected is not shared with any one else. The system ensures we are getting timely, informative alerts out to our residents to keep them aware of the latest events that are impacting the community.

WHAT DO I GET FOR MY HANOVER BOROUGH RESIDENTIAL REFUSE SERVICE FEES

1. Weekly garbage collection.
2. Once a month curbside pickup of recyclables.
3. Curbside collection of leaves from Fall to Early Winter.
4. Curbside yard and garden waste collection in May & October.
5. Free collection of storm tree damage such as downed limbs, brush, and wood.
6. Free collection of Christmas trees.
7. Use of Hanover's Recycling Center to take newsprint, cardboard, metal, bi-metal cans, aluminum, clear glass bottles, green glass bottles, and brown glass bottles, magazines, and quality paper so that you can avoid having more than 3 garbage containers and paying for excess refuse.
8. Street sweeping year round as weather allows
9. Storm water drainage inlet cleaning.
10. Collection of litter and public refuse containers at parks, playgrounds, and on the square.
11. Collection of road kill carcasses within the Borough.
12. Access to "special" pickups for extra refuse, and property cleanups
13. One large item pickup weekly free—please contact Public Works to arrange.
14. Access to the Transfer Station to dispose of your own large items and construction waste such as roof shingles, wallboard, sinks, and commodes.
15. Disposal of tires (rims removed) , paints, (lids off dried paint) and appliances (doors removed) as refuse.
16. Ability to discuss any concerns or issues with a staff in a local office.

Residents with driveways should clear an area to the right of your driveway (when facing your driveway from the street) to give the snow on the blade of the plow a place to empty before it gets to your driveway. This will help to lessen the amount of snow pushed back in front of your driveway. Residents with on street only parking should pile snow on the curb line. Please be mindful that it is illegal to push snow from a parking lot, sidewalk or driveway onto a street or alleyway.

HOW TO PREVENT FROZEN WATER PIPES


INSIDE YOUR HOUSE

1. Open the cabinets under the sinks in your kitchen and bathrooms to allow heated air to circulate around the water pipes.
2. Set your thermostat at a minimum of 55 degrees, especially when you are gone for the day or away for a long time.
3. Let indoor faucets drip, but don't run a heavy stream of water. (remember it only takes a small drip) if you plan to be away during cold temps.

OUTSIDE YOUR HOUSE


1. Protect faucets, outdoor pipes, and pipes in unheated areas with pipe insulation. In a pinch wrapping them with rags, newspapers, trash bags, plastic foam or even bubble wrap can add needed protection.
2. Cover any vents around your home's foundation.
3. Drain water hoses and store them in a garage or shed.
4. Make sure you know where your house's shutoff valve is and how to turn it on and off.

LOCUST STREET SNOW EMERGENCY OFF STREET PARKING



MS4

Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System

What is this, MS4 and what is required?

Untreated stormwater runoff that discharges to our streams

Comprised of ditches, man-made channels, anything that transport flow of our water

The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) phase II new permit regulations require coverage for discharges from MS4s

Our Borough is required to comply with the new program effective in 2018

Programs are intended to improve our Nation's waters by reducing quantities of pollutants that are picked up by runoff and transported through MS4s during rain events




